## DO YOU HAVE A FEMALE MP OR LOCAL COUNCILLOR?

PROCESSIONS provides an opportunity to understand what it is like for women who hold elected positions today.

Consider using the following template as a guide to write to your MP or local councillor and invite them to visit your banner-making workshop.

If you can, write the letter as soon as possible so they have plenty of time to reply. Remember: MPs are usually in their constituencies on Friday, Saturday and Sunday each week.

You could:

- Write a letter to your MP at: House of Commons, London SW1A 0AA
- Email your MP using the contact details in [www.parliament.uk](http://www.parliament.uk)'s [Directory of MPs](#)
- Find your local councillor's contact details on your council website or through your council's helpdesk; they will generally provide an email or postal address.

- What the Representation of the People Act is and why it was made.
- Which participants in our group are registered to vote, what this means to them and if they feel their vote counts.
- Where women's power comes from in the 21st century.
- What the main barriers are that women who hold elected positions face today.

We would like to invite you to visit our banner-making workshop to speak about your experience of holding a position of elected office, what the barriers are that you face and how you feel that your gender has helped or hindered your experience.

By meeting with elected officials, we hope to address local barriers to political participation and close the gap between those who hold elected positions and those who could.
